

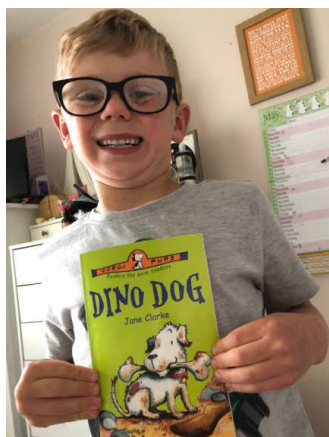
Dear Rousseau Class,

Can you guess what this one is called?

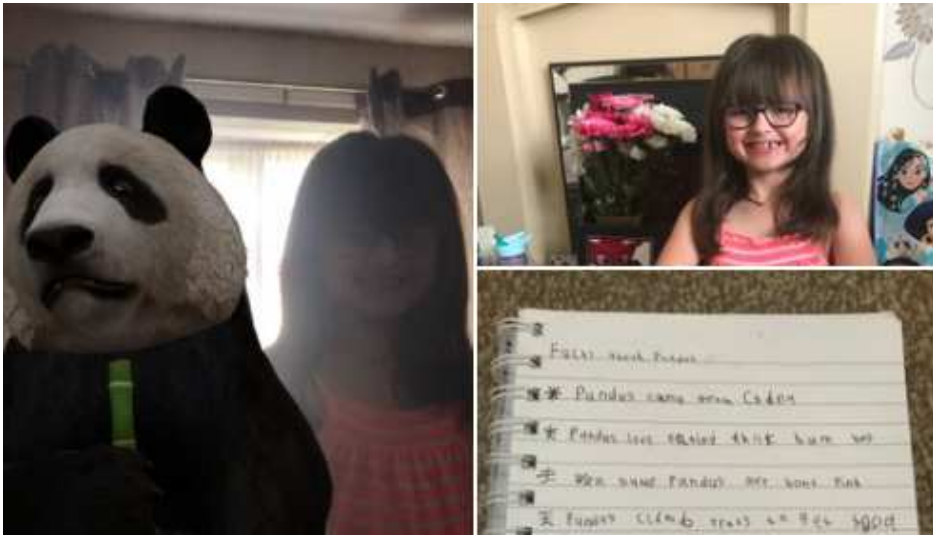


Leah's Grandma has been reading the 'Far Away Tree to her and her brother every morning on FaceTime. Leah wrote about her favourite character and illustrated it.

She has also been working hard on her writing skills. Can you guess from the photo what she has been researching?



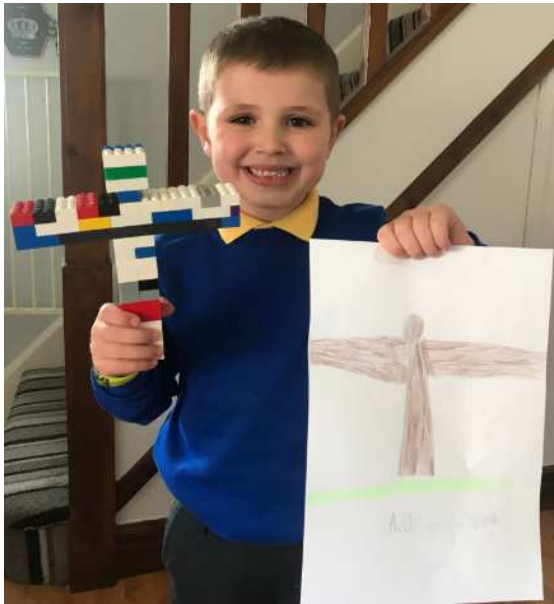
Madeleine has taken on the role of a scientist with her slime science kit and is enjoying reading her books. What and where have you been reading this week?



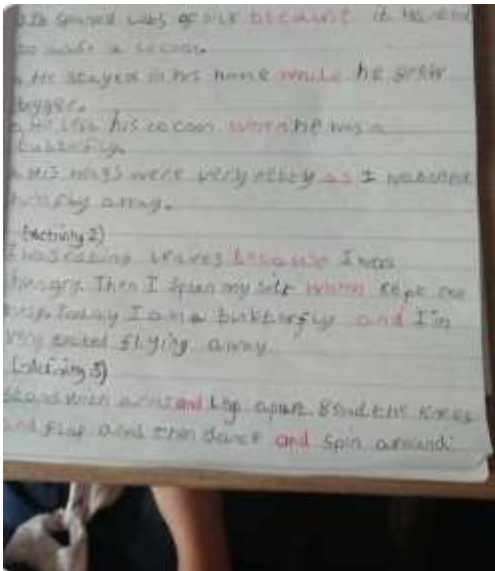

Abigail and Oscar are missing school so much that they wanted to wear their uniforms for home school. You both look wonderful. Especially the smiles you are wearing!



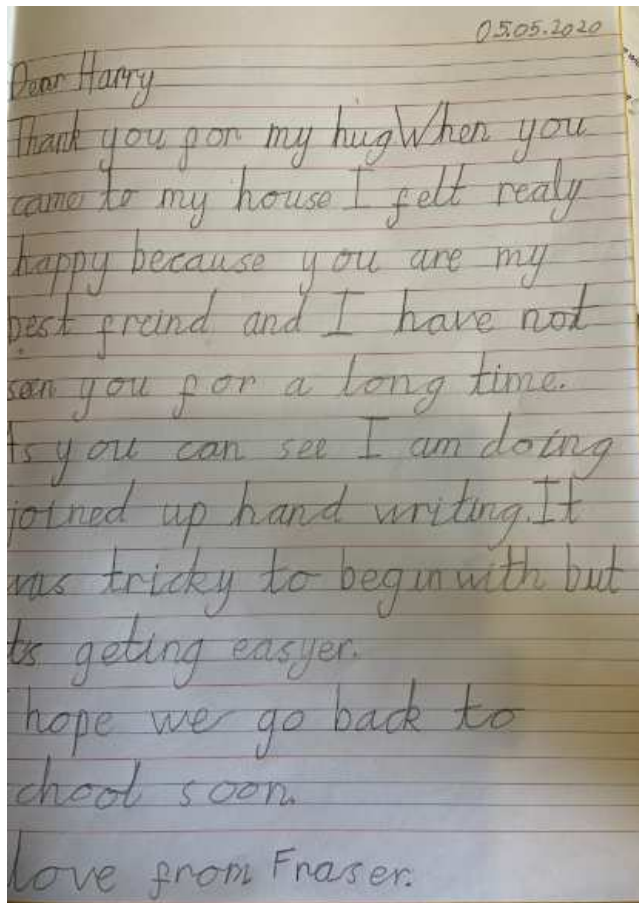
Oscar has been finding out all about the Angel of the North as part of our topic works and created a fantastic representation of it using lego.

Who can challenge themselves to half past times or even quarter past and quarter to? Tricky!



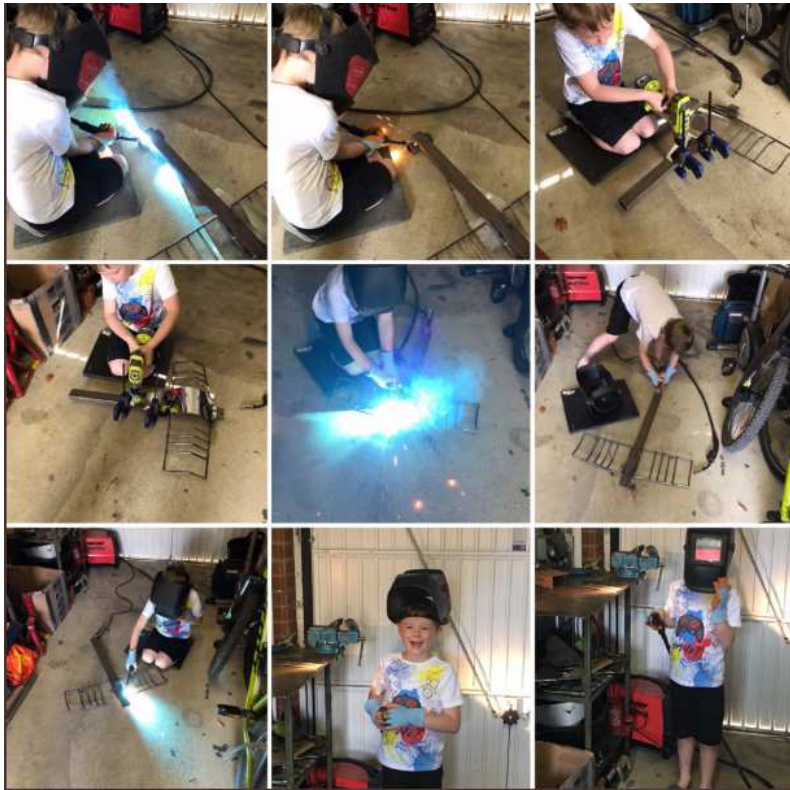

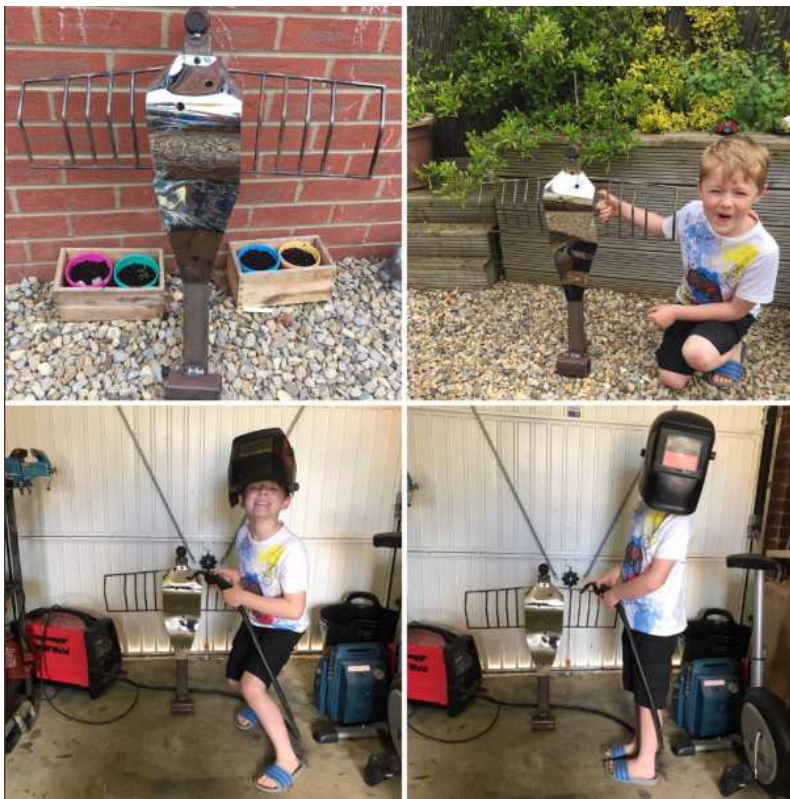


Lola's has been practicing her writing some more this week, she decided she would write down what she could remember about what she had learnt about the great fire of London.
