## Patience is a Virtue!

As you are well aware, our building work is now well underway. This work has been at the planning stage for a very long time and major hurdles have needed to be overcome in order to begin. Essentially, four extensions are being added to the existing building. There will be extension to our Early Years classroom and an additional classroom next to Mondrian class for our KS1 children. (You will see that a temporary road has been installed in order to access this area of school.) An additional classroom will be built adjacent to Dali class as well as another classroom close to the school gate. There will be a new office suite and entrance system which will improve security of the site. Work will also be completed on four existing classrooms to create corridors and these rooms will be extended to ensure no space is lost for our children. The church car park is to be extended and will also

have a drop off zone with pedestrian route straight into the school grounds. Hopefully this will mean that our older children can be dropped off and thus there will be less congestion. Clearly, we have much to contend with over the coming months and staff are working closely with the builders to ensure that our children are safe and that disruption is at a minimum. Most of the work is due to be completed by September and the builders are expected to leave the site completely by October half-term holiday. I would like to commend all our staff for their patience during this time and most especially for their dedication to ensuring our pupils maintain an excellent school experience.

I continue to thank all families for their patience also, particularly with regard to traffic issues. It will be many months before the car parks will be fully accessible again. Please try to find an alternative way to travel to school if at all possible. If a car journey is essential, please consider parking away from the school and walking the final part of the journey, or perhaps consider car sharing with your neighbours? A number of concerns have been raised with regard to traffic on Station Road and we have had several "near misses." A traffic survey has been completed and the police are monitoring the situation regularly. There may also be monitoring with a mobile CCTV unit. Police will

issue penalty notices to any driver who parks on zig-zag or yellow lines, as well as to those close to junctions.

If you choose to use the church car park please be mindful that Fr Mark needs access at all times. Please, therefore, do not park in front of church or at the entrance to the car park.

Final nag!-If you have been involved in any minor accidents in the car park please inform school. We have had a couple of "hit and run" incidents.

Most of all, well done, to our children; they continue to be amazing even during all the disruption.

Fingers crossed all will be completed well.
