# **Uniform Policy**

Most of the uniform is available in high street shops and specific items such as school coat, sweatshirt, cardigan, polo shirt, PE kit and book bag are available to order from the school office.

#### Winter Uniform

Grey trousers Gold t-shirt with collar Royal blue sweatshirt Black shoes (not trainers) Grey pinafore or skirt Gold t-shirt with collar Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan Black shoes (not trainers)

#### **Summer Uniform**

Grey trousers or shorts Gold t-shirt with collar Royal blue sweatshirt Black shoes (not trainers) Blue and white gingham dress Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan Black shoes (not trainers)

#### P.E. Kit

Gold t-shirt Royal blue shorts Plimsolls or trainers Tracksuit or warm trousers and top (Football boots may be worn on the school field)

#### **Jewellery**

Watches may be worn but must be removed for PE lessons. Make up and fashion jewellery are not considered acceptable or appropriate for school.

#### Hair

Long hair should be tied or pinned back so that it does not cover the face or desk. Hair styles which may distract pupils are to be discouraged.

### **Special Circumstances**

In specific circumstances, for example for reasons of faith or culture, it may be difficult for some pupils to fully conform to the uniform policy. Parents should discuss this with the head teacher.
