



## Review of Pupil Premium Investment 2013-14

Pupils Currently Eligible for Pupil Premium funding:

A total of 19 children on role were eligible for Pupil Premium funding during 2013-14.

Children who are eligible for free school meals remain eligible for Pupil Premium funding for six years.

Children whose parents are members of the Military Services are also eligible for reduced Pupil Premium funding.

For the financial year 2013-14 we received £20,700, paid in three termly payments. This is based on 23 children eligible in Spring 2013.

A number of children eligible for Pupil Premium funding also fell into other categories, including children with SEND.
