A total of 12 children on current role are eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Currently 7 children are eligible for free school meals

Children who are eligible for free school meals remain eligible for Pupil Premium funding for six years.

Children who are looked after are eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Children whose parents are members of the Military Services are also eligible for reduced Pupil Premium funding.

For the financial year 2015-16 we will be in receipt of £12,480, paid in three termly payments.

Some children eligible for Pupil Premium funding in our school also fall into other categories, including children with SEND.
